About Freedom School Partners

About Freedom School Partners:

Freedom School Partners (FSP) is a nonprofit located in Charlotte, NC that provides a six-week summer learning experience for those who need it most. Our mission is to inspire our scholars to love reading and learning, believe in themselves, and create extraordinary futures.

We fulfill this mission by:

- 1. Delivering a culturally diverse and responsive curriculum that affirms our scholars with engaging literature and exposure to the broader community.
- 2. Serving families and children who lack access to high quality summer learning and enrichment opportunities and infusing every day with joy and Freedom School magic.
- 3. Addressing the whole child by supporting their academic, social, emotional and basic needs.
- 4. Offering a workforce development opportunity for college students that positions them to increase social capital and instills skills and competencies that will make them competitive in the professional marketplace.
- 5. Collaborating with diverse community stakeholders who contribute to and benefit from the partnerships.
- 6. Advocating relentlessly for our scholars by focusing on educational equity and on the root causes of academic achievement gaps.

Our Vision: A community fiercely committed to embracing, elevating, and educating all children as our own.

Our Values:

- We lead with what's best for our scholars.
- We love and respect our scholars for who they are <u>now</u>: worthy, unique, whole people who

FSP primarily serves K-8th grade students ("Scholars") who do not have access to quality summer learning programs. In 2024, FSP will serve 700 scholars at 13 Freedom School sites throughout Charlotte-Mecklenburg.

Freedom Schools are part of Children's Defense Funds' six-week, literacy-rich summer program with focus on social/emotional skills and community building. Freedom School, Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. begins with breakfast followed by *Harambee!*, a daily pep rally with a volunteer guest reader. After an energizing morning, scholars participate in 2 hours and 30 minutes of the nationally-developed Integrated Reading Curriculum, engaging with books diverse in history and culture, allowing scholars to see themselves in the stories they read. Then, scholars Drop Everything and Read (D.E.A.R) during a silent reading period. Lunch kicks off the rest of the day, followed by an enriching afternoon program that includes STEAM activities, games, educational field trips. Freedom School provides two healthy meals, a snack and program transportation. Books are sent home weekly to build personal libraries.



About Freedom School Partners

History

Founded in 1999, Freedom School Partners (formerly Seigle Avenue Partners) received significant start-up funding from the Foundation for the Carolinas (FFTC) Building Youth Initiative and Seigle Avenue Presbyterian Church. In 2004, FSP was selected by the Children's Defense Fund (CDF) to join community organizations around the country and serve as a local sponsor for CDF's six-week summer reading program called Freedom School. That year, FSP launched its first CDF Freedom School serving 100 students. Freedom School uses a unique model where college students, called Servant Leader Interns (SLIs), complete 90 hours of extensive training and lead our scholars each day in the curriculum. SLIs become role models and cheerleaders for the scholars. FSP accepts students without regard for their achievement levels and primarily serves students without access to quality literacy and enrichment programming.

Closing the gap

Summer learning loss is the largest factor contributing to the achievement gap in school performance for low-income students (National Center for Summer Learning, Johns Hopkins University). Most children in poverty are disproportionately affected by losses in reading, with at-risk students losing more than 2-3 months in reading achievement every summer, while their more affluent peers make slight gains. This loss is cumulative (Horizon National); thus, low-income youth are less likely to graduate from high school or enter college. Students who read on grade level by third grade are 96% more likely to graduate high school, which is a critical upward mobility indicator (Charlotte-Mecklenburg Opportunity Task Force).

2023 impact by the numbers:

- 653 scholars served
- 34,000 meals were provided to scholars
- 84% of parents/caregivers reported an increase in their child's love for reading
- FSP provided nearly 21,700 school supply and personal care items to scholars, families, and the community
- 1,894 volunteers provided 6,800 hours of service to our scholars

Scholar Impact – FSP's impact is measured through an independent evaluation conducted by the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. The UNC Charlotte Center for Adolescent Literacies (CFAL) administers the Ekwall/Shanker Reading Inventory to measure if scholars gain or maintain in their reading ability. UNC Charlotte's Center for Education Measurement and Evaluation (CEME) and CFAL conduct an efficacy survey that assesses scholar attitudes.

• In 2023, 80% of scholars gained or maintained in reading ability.



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Freedom School Lingo

The Children's Defense Fund Freedom Schools program is a national program from The Children's Defense Fund (CDF) – a child advocacy agency in Washington, DC. Freedom School Partners is the largest provider of the Freedom School program in the nation.

D.E.A.R. – **Drop Everything And Read.** Scholars read independently, or with volunteers, every day.

Finale – Finales are end-of-Freedom School celebrations held at each site to highlight the learning over the program and honor the scholars, interns, and site coordinators who participate in Freedom School.

Harambee! – In Kiswahili, *Harambee!* means "Let's pull together." It is a daily pep rally that occurs Monday-Friday between 8:30 – 9:00 a.m. at every site. *Harambee!* includes cheers, chants, songs, and a community "read aloud" guest.

Jubilee - Freedom School Partners' city-wide celebration of summer learning. All Charlotte Freedom School sites are brought together under one roof to experience a giant *Harambee!* and showcase their sites' individuality with unique cheers and chants. Jubilee is July 12th from 10:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. at the Grady Cole Center.

Integrated Reading Curriculum (IRC) – Scholars participate in IRC for 2 hours and 30 minutes each day at Freedom School. The Integrated Reading Curriculum includes a combination of the following: cooperative group activities, conflict resolution skill building, social action activities and more. On average, Level I scholars (K-2nd grade) read a book a day, Level Ione chapters (3rd - 5th grade) read about 3-5 books a week, and Level III scholars (6th- 8th grade) read about a chapter book a week. This is truly a special time for interns and scholars to focus on the curriculum, work on their literacy skills and do team building activities such as skits, talk shows, interviews and summaries.

Junior Servant Leader Interns (JSLs) – Former scholars who are now high school students and serve as site assistants. They also might participate in our FSP Academy during the academic school year.

On-Site Activities (OSAs) – Afternoon activities conducted at the site. Enrichment Providers help plan and assist with a fun 30 to 90-minute activity using their skills, interests, or hobbies. Some examples include yoga, bubble-making, robotics, or a mini soccer camp.

Regional Site Managers – Work closely with the Tiffany Williams, Partnership and Programming Officer to support site management.

Scholars – Freedom School students in Levels I (K-2nd), II (3rd-5th), and III (6th-8th).

Servant Leader Interns (SLIs) – College students that teach and serve a class of about 10 scholars.

Site Administrative Interns (SAIs) – Freedom School seasonal staff member providing administrative support to the site and Site Coordinator. May also assist SLIs with classroom management.

Site Coordinators (SCs) – Manager of the Freedom School site. Responsible for the well-being of scholars, SLIs, and the Freedom School program at their site. Site Coordinators report to their assigned Regional Site Manager.
